Why should we cut down our forests?

“At 4.3 to 5 billion cubic metres per year, global consumption of wood is already higher than what can actually be sustainably extracted from forests - namely 3 billion cubic metres per year.”¹

The extensive use of straw as the main component conserves valuable resources and contributes to the preservation of forests.

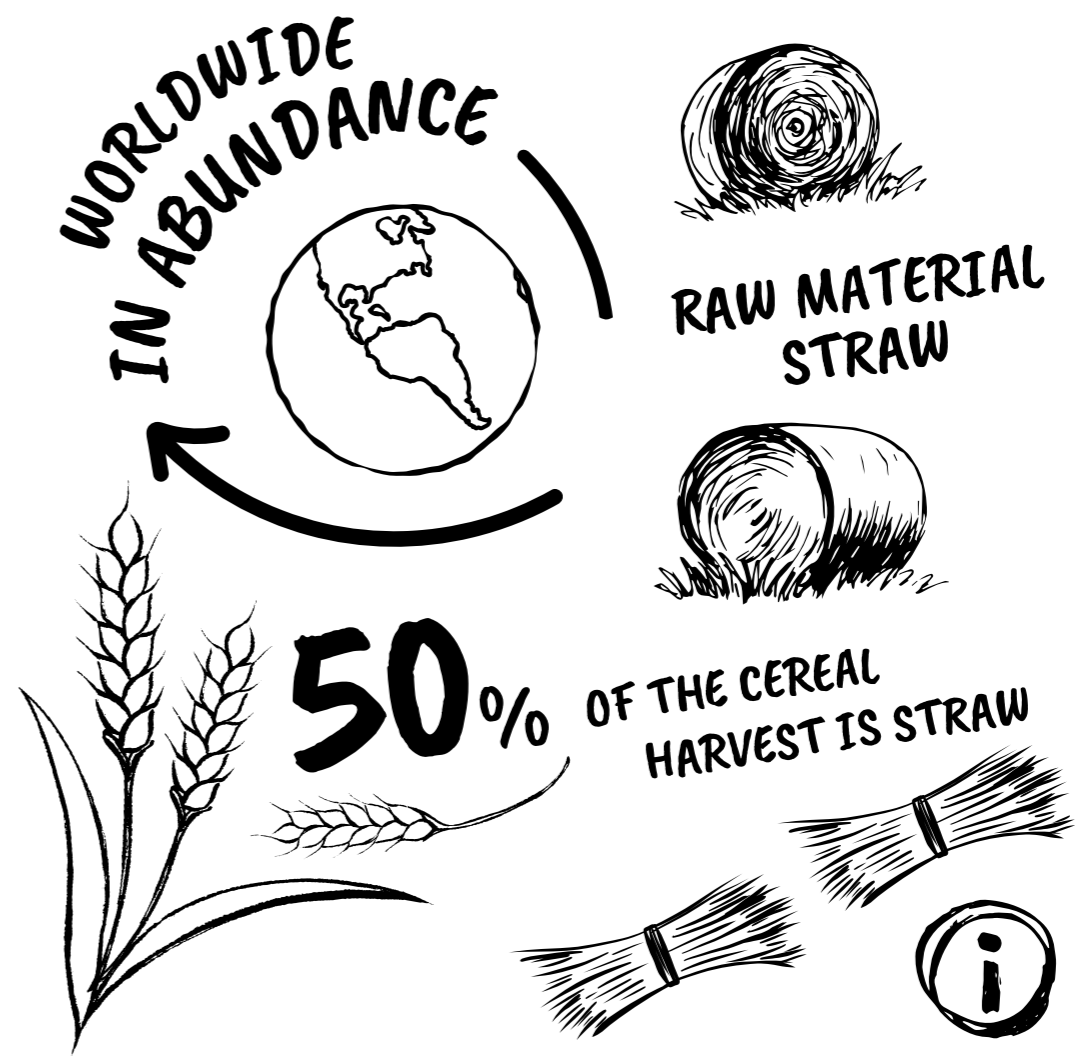




...when surplus straw is the sustainable alternative?

*"In Germany, there is an annual surplus of grain straw of 5 to 13 million tonnes, which can be used as a valuable resource after deduction for agricultural purposes."*³

Straw is a natural raw material that grows back every year. As a waste product of grain, straw is not in competition with the food industry and is available worldwide. In addition to its many practical benefits, straw is also a fully recyclable material that can be easily returned to the natural cycle at the end of its useful life.

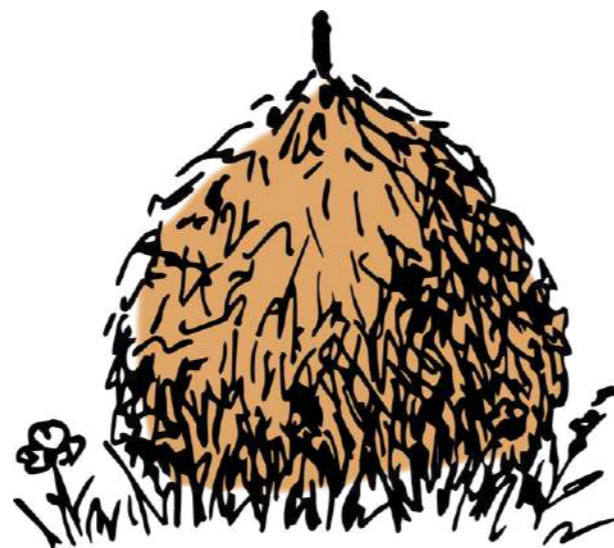

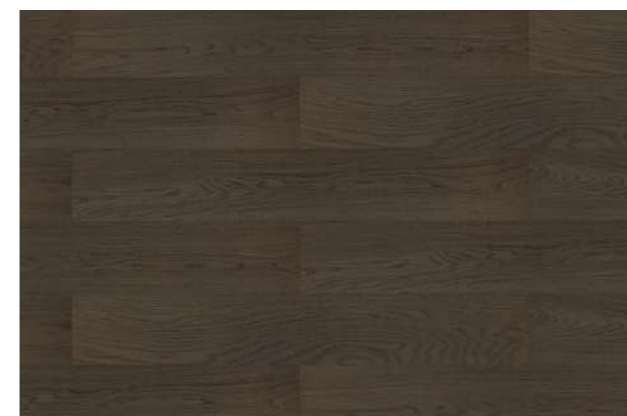

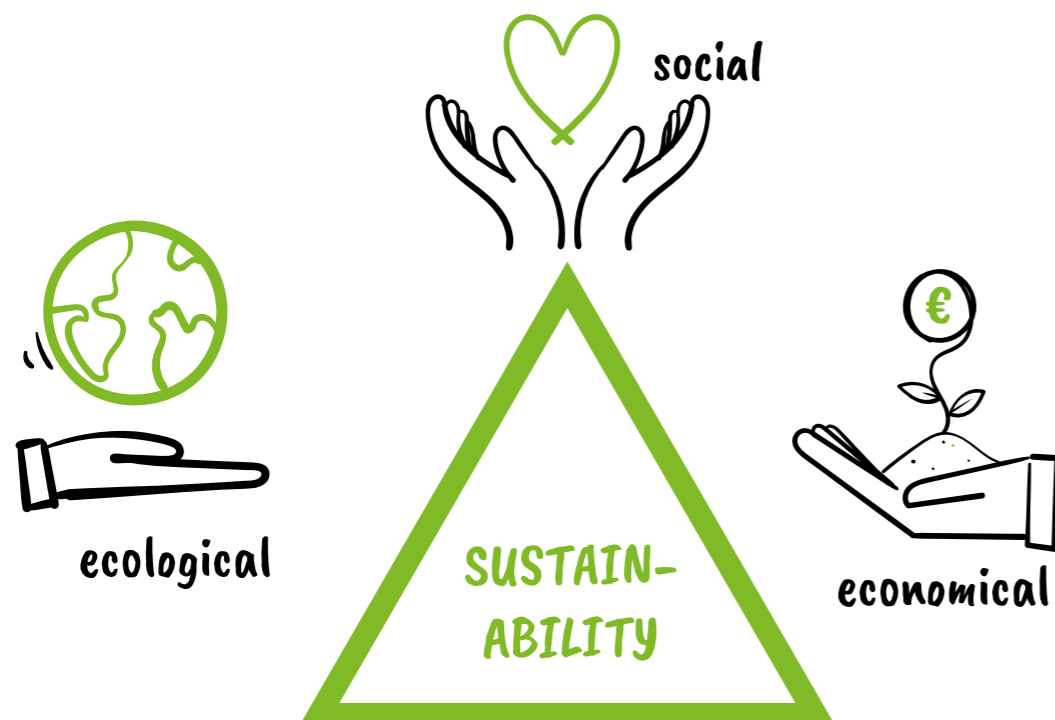


Sustainability at JANGAL - The green way
